**Registered Blind and Partially Sighted People
Year ending 31 March 2003**

England

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INTRODUCTION

This publication contains detailed statistics on persons registered with Councils with Social Services Responsibilities (CSSRs) in England as being blind or partially sighted. The data are compiled from the triennial return SSDA 902 submitted by councils to the Department of Health (Statistics Division 3B).

The CSSR tables in this publication contain information relating to the year ended 31 March 2003. Key points and a summary of historical information for England is included in the tables which follow this introduction.

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KEY POINTS

Register of blind people

- At 31 March 2003 157 thousand people were on the register of blind people.
- Between March 2000 and March 2003 the number on the register of blind people decreased slightly by 1,100 (almost 1%), however since 1982 there has been an overall increase of 45,000 or 40%.
- Since March 2000 the number of blind people on the register has risen in most age groups. The largest growth was in the number of people on the register aged 50-64, which increased by 9% to 14,500 at March 2003.
- However, the number of registered blind people in both the age groups 65-74 and 75 or over declined by around 2% since March 2000. The only age group that has experienced an overall decline since March 1982 is the 65-75 years, which decreased by 20%.
- At 31 March 2003 the percentage of people aged 75 and over was 67% compared with 59% at 31 March 1982. This partly reflects increases in the population in this age group.
- 13,000 people joined the register of blind people during 2002-03, about 70 more people than in 1999-2000. Over the last 20 years the number of people registering as blind within the survey year has been between 12,000 to 14,000, peaking in the 12 months to March 1994.

Register of partially sighted people

- At 31 March 2003 155 thousand people were on the register of partially sighted people. This is an increase of around 6,500 (4%) since March 2000 and more than double the figure at March 1982. The large rise from 1982 may be partly due to old registrations not being removed from the register, either through the death of the client or transfer to the register of blind people.
- There has been an increase in the number of partially sighted people on the registers for most age groups since March 2000. The largest increase is in the 5-17 age group (16% since March 2000). The only age group in which the number of partially sighted people declined was 0-4 year olds with a 6% decrease.
- At 31 March 1982, 55% of people on the partially sighted register were aged 75 or over. The proportion had increased to 68% in March 2003. The overall increase may be partly reflecting the increase in the population of this age group, and possibly due to client records being kept on the registers, either through the client's death or transfer of the client to the register of blind people.
- 16,600 people joined the register of partially sighted people during 2002-03, about 900 fewer people than in 1999-2000. Between 1982 and 2003 the number of people registering as partially sighted within the survey year has nearly doubled from 9,000 to 16,000.

**Registration of people with additional disabilities at 31 March 2003
(based on data returned)**

- 25% of all registered blind people who had an additional disability were also recorded as deaf or having a hearing impairment. About a quarter of these people were blind and deaf, whilst three quarters were blind with a hearing impairment.
- 23% of all registered partially sighted people who had an additional disability were also deaf or had a hearing impairment. A third of these people were partially sighted and deaf whilst two thirds were partially sighted with a hearing impairment.
- A large majority of blind or partially sighted people who were deaf or had a hearing impairment were aged 65 and over.
- 56% of all blind people and 61% of all partially sighted people who had an additional disability were also recorded as having a physical disability.

Figure 1: Number of people registered as blind or partially sighted at 31 March, 1994 - 2003

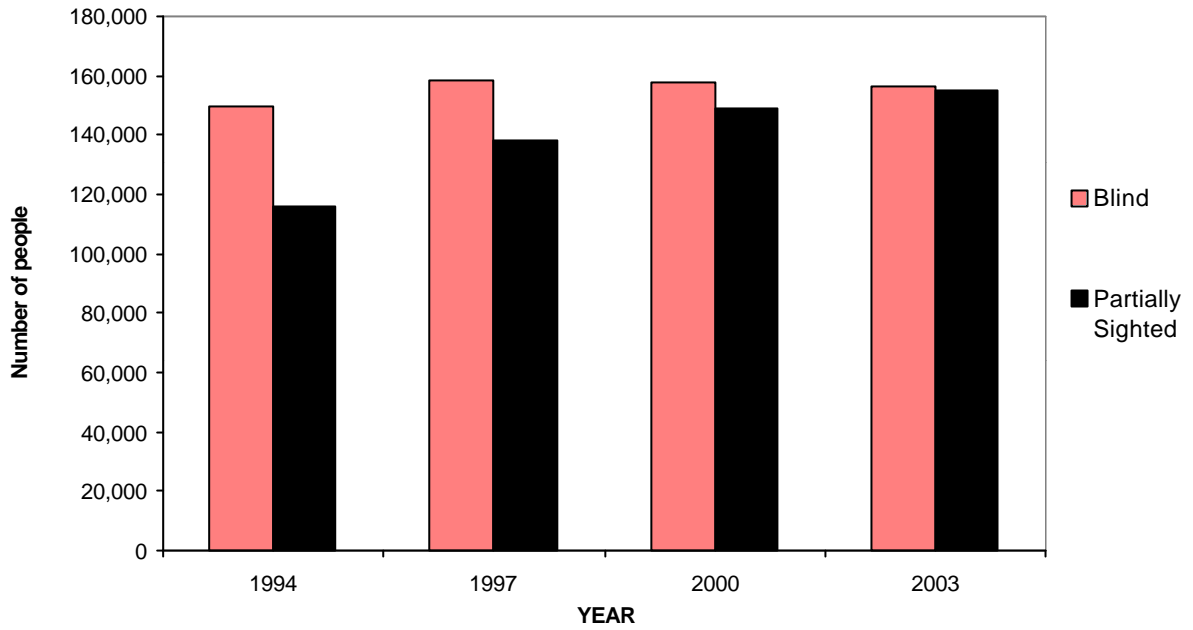
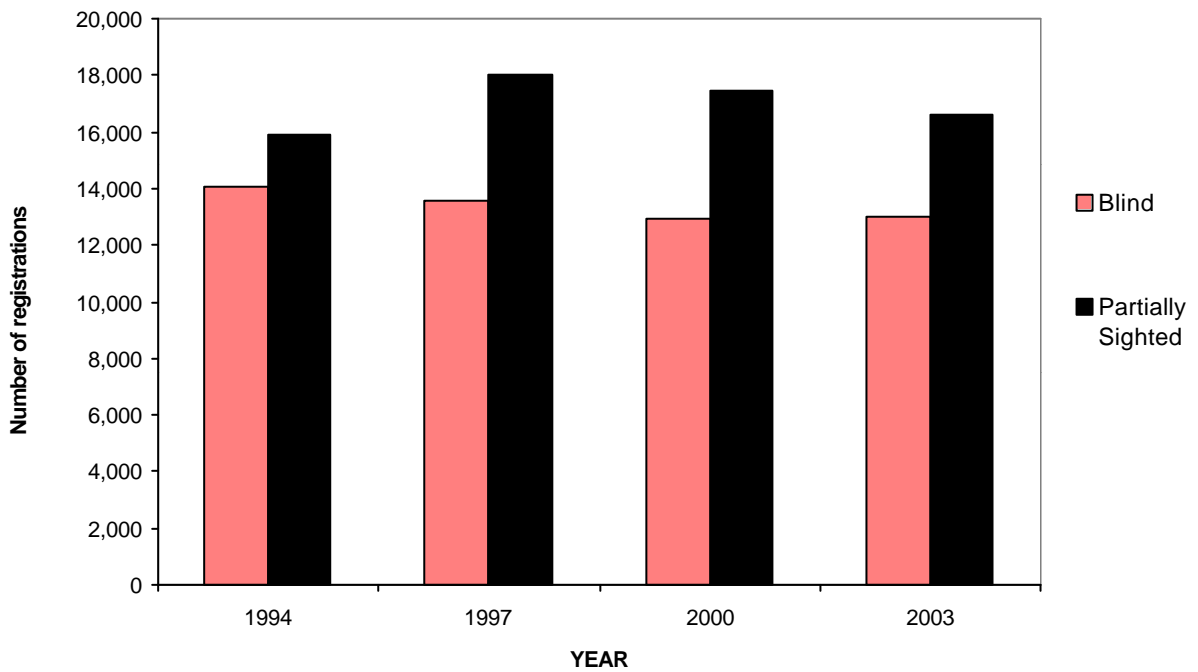


Figure 2: Number of new registrations in the year ending 31 March, 1994 - 2003

Figure 3: Number of people registered as blind at 31 March by age band, 1994 - 2003

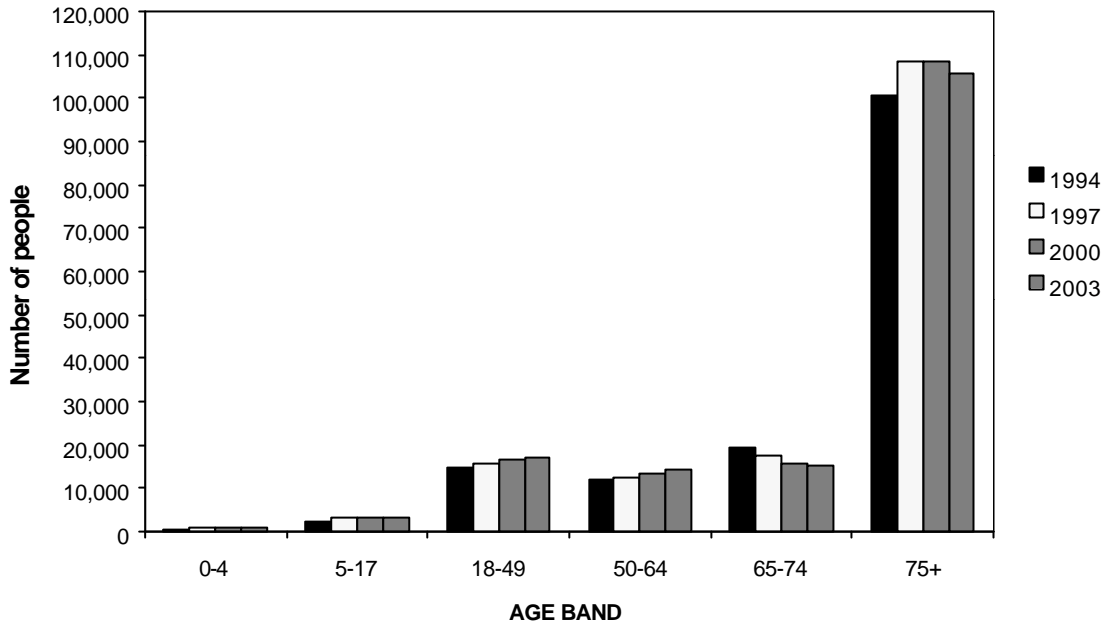


Figure 4: Number of people registered as partially sighted at 31 March by age band, 1994 - 2003

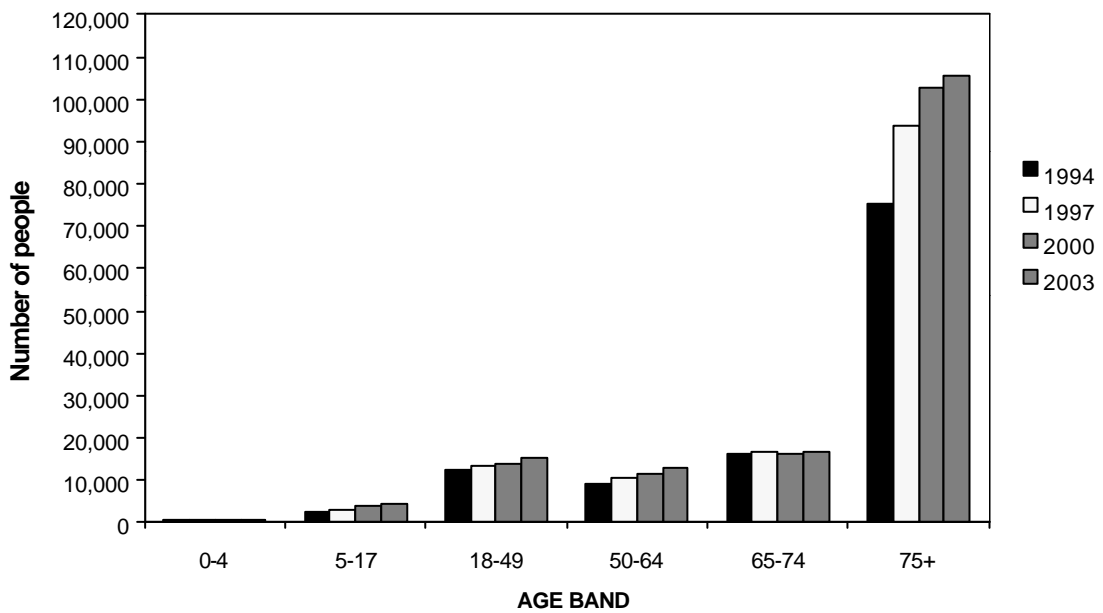
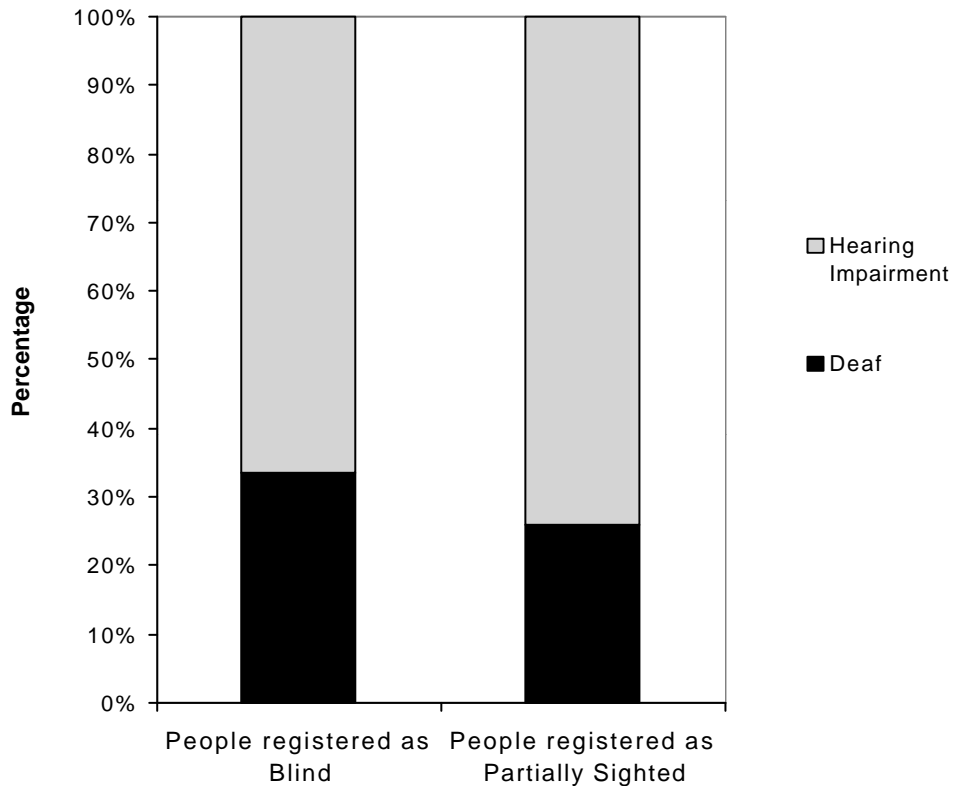

GENERAL NOTES

1. Form SSDA 902 relates to the 'Register of Blind and Partially Sighted Persons' maintained by Councils with Social Services Responsibilities (CSSRs) under Section 29 of the National Assistance Act 1948. The form seeks information on the numbers of persons on each register at the end of the year and the number of new registrations during the last year. Data are also requested on the number of registered blind persons who have an additional disability by age. A copy of the return is included for reference at **Annex A**.
2. Since 1979/80 complete data have normally been collected every third year, commencing with the data for 1981/82. This restriction was imposed in order to reduce the form filling burden on councils. The return for 1984/5 was however postponed for a year in order to coincide with the collection cycle for the BD8 return form (see below) on which data on causes of blindness and partial sight are collected.
3. For people to be registered as blind or partially sighted they must first undergo an examination by a consultant ophthalmologist. The consultant records his or her findings on the standard reporting form BD8, on which the consultant also certifies whether or not the person meets the statutory definition of blindness or the non-statutory definition of partial sight.
4. The statutory definition of blindness is that a person should be "so blind as to be unable to perform any work for which eyesight is essential". There is no equivalent definition of partial sight, but in practice this category refers to persons who, although not blind within the meaning of the 1948 Act, are substantially and permanently disabled by defective vision caused by congenital defect, illness or injury.

Coverage

5. Statistics on all registered blind and partially sighted persons are now collected triennially from all 150 Councils in England, who are asked to complete form SSDA 902 in respect of the situation prevailing at 31 March of the relevant year.
6. Where a council was unable to submit details on the number of registered blind and partially sighted persons with additional disabilities at 31 March 2003, the value is displayed as ".." for "not available". Estimates have not been made where a council has not been able to complete other disabilities in Table 2 and 3 on the SSDA 902 form. Thus for **Tables B3, PS3, B4 and PS4** the totals given are actual totals and do not contain estimates for England or other regions.

Data reliability

7. Registration of blindness is voluntary. However, it is a pre-condition for the receipt of certain financial benefits. It is this factor which gives greater credibility to the "Register of the Blind" than to the "Register of the Partially Sighted" and to other disability registration records maintained by councils, where the voluntary principle also applies. Registration is not, however, a pre-requisite for certain social services concessions and this factor, combined with uncertainties about the regularity with which the councils review and update their records, makes it difficult to assign a degree of reliability to either of these registers.
8. The statistics relating to blind persons who have an additional disability is likely to understate the true numbers, especially in respect of those aged under 16. This is partly because there

is no advantage to the blind person in being registered as having additional disabilities. There may also be reluctance to register pre-school children as blind until they attain age 5, which would affect the figures for this particular age group.

9. Due to additional guidance on deafblind registration (see paragraph 11), where there was information on additional disabilities where a client has multiple disabilities including deaf or hard of hearing, councils were advised to count this under the category of deaf or hard of hearing. This could lead to a bias towards deaf or hard of hearing disabilities.
10. **Because of the difficulties described above, the statistics in this report should be used and interpreted with care.**

Deaf/blind registration

11. Statutory guidance under section 7 of the Local Authority Social Services Act 1970 was issued early in 2001 to Councils with Social Services Responsibilities. This is in response to concerns highlighted by the Department of Health's consultation exercise which looked at social care services for deafblind people. Under the Guidance authorities have been asked to take specific action aimed at improving services for deafblind people. Councils have been asked to:
 - identify, make contact with and keep a record of deafblind people in their catchment area;
 - ensure that assessments of deafblind people are carried out by a specifically trained person/team equipped to assess the needs of a deafblind person;
 - ensure that appropriate services are provided to deafblind people
 - ensure that they are able to access specifically trained one-to one support workers for those people they assess as requiring one;
 - and provide information about services in formats and methods that are accessible to all deafblind people.'

Related statistics

12. The figures in this publication relating to children might be supplemented by the statistics collected by the Department for Education and Employment relating to school children with special educational needs. Previous statistics collected by the Education Department in this series classified such pupils by age breakdown according to their major disability.

Table Conventions

Layout

The first line of the title says what the table contains, the second line shows the breakdowns.

The units in the table are shown at the top right.

Regional and England totals, CSSR type.

These should always be regarded as estimates.

Rounding

Data in all the tables has been rounded to the nearest five. The tables do not show any figures less than six for reasons of confidentiality.

<i>Mentally ill.</i>	Only those suffering from mental illness within the terms of the Mental Health Act 1983, including those in hospital.
<i>People with learning disabilities.</i>	Only those persons with 'severe mental impairment' or 'mental impairment' as defined in the above Act.
<i>People with physical disabilities.</i>	Only those blind persons suffering from defects of a permanent and substantial character, eg a person suffering from paralysis, or crippling diseases, etc.
<i>People who are deaf without speech.</i>	Those who have no useful hearing and whose normal method of communication is by signs, finger spelling or writing.
<i>People who are deaf with speech.</i>	Those who (even with a hearing aid) have little or no useful hearing but whose normal method of communication is by speech and lip-reading.
<i>Hard of hearing people.</i>	Those who (with or without a hearing aid) have some useful hearing and whose normal method of communication is by speech, listening and lip-reading.
